PM Calls for Ensuring Election-Like Arrangement for COVID19 Vaccine Delivery



On 17 October, Prime Minister Narendra Modi reviewed the Covid-19 pandemic situation in the country and the preparedness of vaccine delivery, distribution, and administration. Three vaccines are in advanced stages of development in India, out of which 2 are in Phase II and one is in Phase-III. In an effort to help the global community, the Prime Minister further directed that we should not limit our efforts to our immediate neighbourhood but also reach out to the entire world in providing vaccines,

medicines and IT platforms for vaccine delivery system. PM further directed that keeping in view the geographical span and diversity of the country, the access to the vaccine should be ensured speedily. He insisted on continued social distancing, Covid appropriate behaviour such as wearing the mask, regularly washing hands and sanitation etc. especially in the wake of upcoming festival season.

In a televised address tο the nation, the Prime Minister Narendra Modi made a fervent appeal to all the citizens to not let their guard down and

He appreciated the improvement in the situation all over the country and that economic activity is returning to normal and that people started moving out of their houses to fulfill the responsibilities. He said India is in a better situation due to the efforts of every Indian in the last 7-8 months and one should not let it deteriorate. PM noted that the recovery rate in the country has improved and the fatality rate is low. He urged citizens to be vigilant while fulfilling their responsibilities.

India's Energy Sector to Be Growth Centric, Industry Friendly and Environment Conscious, Says PM



On 26 October, Prime Minister Narendra Modi interacted with CEOs of leading oil & gas companies in the annual event organized by NITI Aayog and Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas. During the interaction, PM highlighted that energy is at the centre of human development, which is why conversations around the energy sector are important. He said that at the core of the government's policy is providing equitable access of clean, affordable and sustainable energy to all Indians, for which the country has adopted an integrated approach. He underlined that with the government taking a series of policy steps to make India an attractive destination, investment there tremendous opportunities in the energy sector in India. India now allows 100% FDI in exploration and production projects and has permitted 49% FDI in public sector refining under the automatic route. PM also added as part of India's Neighbourhood First Policy, development of energy corridors with our neighbouring countries is prioritized for mutual benefit.



Corruption Across Generations a Major Hurdle in the Progress of the Country: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the National Conference on Vigilance and Anti-Corruption on the theme सतर्क भारत,

समृद्ध भारत (Vigilant India, Prosperous India) today through video conferencing.



The event was organized by the Central Bureau of Investigation focusing on Vigilance issues aimed at raising awareness and reaffirming India's commitment to promotion of integrity and probity in public life through citizen participation. PM stressed the necessity for the administrative systems to transparent, responsible, accountable, answerable to the public. He added that the biggest enemy against this is any form of corruption. He said one hand corruption hurts the development of the country and on the other it destroys the social balance as well as the trust that people should have in the system. And therefore, he said tackling corruption is not just the responsibility of any single agency or institution but that it is a collective responsibility. He said corruption cannot be dealt with a stand-alone approach.

During April-August 2020, despite COVID-19, FDI inflow get a growth of 13%, Highest ever for first 5 months of a Financial Year.

In what is an acknowledgement of the country's leadership of the global movement, India has been re-elected as president of the International Solar Alliance (ISA) for two more years. France was re-elected as Co-President at the virtual meeting of the third assembly of the ISA held on 14 October. Speaking in the plenary, the President of the ISA assembly, India's Power and New and Renewable Minister, Mr R.K. Energy appreciated the Alliance Members coming together to work for combating climate change. The meeting approved the institutionalize initiatives to engagement with the private and public corporate sector through the Coalition for Sustainable Climate Action (CSCA). The International Solar Alliance is an initiative that was launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and then French President François Hollande on November 30, 2015 on the side-lines of the COP-21 summit in Paris, France.



Manufacturing Sector Growth Pushes India among Top 3 Emerging Economies

Despite a devastative impact of the Covid-19 on the world economy, India has seen a steady recovery in the manufacturing sector, helping the country climb two notches to the third position among key emerging markets in September. In September, India's merchandise exports rose 6% on-year to \$27.6 billion. Among the other emerging markets that have reported their export data for September, only China (10% growth) fared better than India. The growth in manufacturing





could also be attributed to the new rulebook of 'Atmanirbhar Bharat'. India has made a point to rely on its manufacturing capabilities, for which the government of India has relaxed the rules to allow ease of manufacturing in the country. As per reports, only China and Brazil rank better than India.

Department of Posts (DOP), Ministry of Communications released a commemorative postage stamp on the 75th anniversary of the United Nations Organisations on 23rd October 2020.



In his remarks at the release of the commemorative postage stamp, Dr. S Jaishankar, External Affairs Minister (EAM) as Chief Guest, welcomed the timely initiative of Department of Posts to propose the UN@75 Commemorative Postage Stamp on the eve of the founding of the United Nations. He highlighted that as a founding member of the United Nations, India was deeply invested in UN's success and had been at the forefront of UN Peacekeeping Operations.

It may be noted that Department of Posts has previously released similar such commemorative postage stamps on UN's 9th, 40th and 50th Anniversaries in 1954, 1985 and 1995 respectively.

Capital Goods: Building India of Tomorrow


India's Capital Goods manufacturing industry serves as a strong base for its engagement across sectors such as Engineering, Construction, Infrastructure and Consumer goods, amongst others. Indian Electrical equipment is the largest sub-sector followed by Plant equipment & Earth moving/ mining machinery. Capital Goods industry in India provides approximately 1.4 mn direct and 7 mn indirect jobs. 100% FDI is allowed under the automatic route.

Jantar Mantar: Expression of Astronomical Skills and Cosmological Concepts

Built in 1724 by Maharaja Jai Singh II of Jaipur, Jantar Mantar is one of the five astronomical observatories built by the king in Northern India. Its striking combinations of geometric forms have caught the attention of architects, artists and art historians from around the world. It was designed for the observation of astronomical positions with the naked eye. It is a part of the tradition of the Ptolemaic positional astronomy, which was common in a lot of civilisations. Jantar Mantar comprises 13 astronomy instruments that were used to predict the movements and timings of the planets, the sun and the moon. It is an expression of the astronomical skills and cosmological concepts of the court of a scholarly prince at the end of the Mughal period.

India, Vietnam Need to Intensify Trade Relations to Achieve Potential



Addressing a webinar on India-Vietnam Business Forum organized by the Indian Chamber of Commerce and Vietnam Chamber of Commerce and Industry on 20 October, Ms. Riva Ganguly Das, Secretary (East), Ministry of External Affairs said, India is the 7th largest trading partner of Vietnam and the trade relationship between both sides has grown from a meager bilateral figure of US\$ 200 million in the year 2000 to US\$ 12.34 billion in FY 2019-20 ." At the same time, she also pointed to the need to tap more opportunities and said "Our bilateral trade turnover is still not commensurate with the levels of our economic development and therefore, we need to do more to broaden and intensify our trade relations to achieve its full potential". Further, Ambassador Pranay Verma noted that for robust economic engagement between the countries, it is important to identify sectors and engage in B-2-B tie-ups.

Ambassador Pays Tribute to President Ho Chi Minh at the Kim Lien Monument



Embassy of India Reaches Out to Yen Bai Province




