Prime Minister Addresses 17th ASEAN India Summit



On 12 November, Prime Minister Narendra Modi participated in the 17th ASEAN-India Summit at the invitation of H.E. Nguyen Xuan Phuc, Prime Minister of Vietnam, the current Chair of ASEAN. The Summit, which saw the participation of all ten ASEAN Member States, was conducted in virtual format. Speaking at the Summit, PM reaffirmed the centrality of ASEAN in India's Act East policy and Indo Pacific vision. The 17th ASEAN-India Summit draws to a close, with PM and ASEAN leaders paving the way for India-ASEAN partnership to march on a path of deeper progress and wider connectivity, especially in a post-pandemic world. On COVID-19, PM Modi highlighted India's response and broader support to the international community and welcomed ASEAN's initiatives to fight the pandemic. Prime Minister announced a contribution of US\$ 1 million to the COVID-19 ASEAN Response Fund.

Liberalized Guidelines issued by Government of India

With an aim to qualitatively improve the Ease of Doing Business of the IT Industry particularly Business Process Outsourcing (BPO) and IT Enabled Services, the Government has drastically simplified the Other Service Provider(OSP) guidelines of the Department of Telecom. The new guidelines tremendously reduce the compliance burden of the BPO industry.

It is clarified that the registration requirement for OSPs has been done away with altogether and the BPO industry engaged in data related work have been taken out of the ambit of OSP regulations. In addition, requirements such as deposit of bank guarantees, requirement for static IPs, frequent reporting obligations, publication of network diagram, penal provisions etc. have also been removed. Similarly, several other requirements, whichprevented companies from adopting 'Work from Home' and 'Work from Anywhere' policies have also been removed. Additional dispensations to enhance flexibility for the Industry have been allowed.

The new framework will provide a strong impetus to India's industry and will make India one of the most competitive TI jurisdictions in the World. The new guidelines are inspired by Prime Minister Modi's strong emphasis on Minimum Government, Maximum Governance. India's IT Industry is a source of pride for the country and the new guidelines are aimed at removing mnacessary bureaucratic restrictions to allow the industry to focus on innovative new products and solutions. Qutub Minar: World's Tallest Brick Minaret

Qutub Minar, one of the iconic tourism sites in India, in red and buff sandstone is the world's tallest brick minaret. Standing 73-foot-tall, this five-storeyed tower, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, remains one of the most magnificent buildings of India from the medieval era. Located in Delhi's Mehrauli area, the Qutub Minar was commissioned by Qutub-ud-din Aibak, who laid the foundation of Mamluk dynasty of Delhi Sultanat (1206-1290) in India. Inspired by the victory tower at Ghazni, Afghanistan, its construction began in 1192 AD but, unfortunately, Qutub-ud-din-Aibak, did not live long enough to witness its completion. The tower was finally completed by his successors Iltutmish and Firoz Shah Tughlaq.
