Prime Minister Launches World's Largest Vaccination Drive Against COVID-19 in India

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi launched the pan India rollout of COVIDvaccination drive video 19 via conferencing on 16 January. This is the world's largest vaccination program covering the entire length and breadth of the country. Paying compliments to the associated scientists with the development of the vaccines, PM said, usually it takes years to prepare a vaccine but here, in such a short time, not one but two made-in-India vaccine were launched. PM put the unprecedented scale of the vaccination drive in perspective by informing that, in the first round itself, 3 crore people, which is more than population of at least 100 countries of the world, are being vaccinated. 


PM Calls Upon the Scientific Community to Strengthen Value Creation Cycle in Science, Technology and Industry

PM Dedicates Kochi - Mangaluru Natural Gas Pipeline to the Nation



UN Security Council Open Debate on International Cooperation in Combating Terrorism



On 12 January, EAM Dr. S. Jaishankar addressed UN Security Council Open Debate chaired by Tunisia on threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts. He proposed an 8-point Plan of Action for effectively countering terrorism and called on international community to commit to goal of zero tolerance for terrorism. Terrorism continued to be the gravest threat to mankind and attacked the "very

foundations of humanity", he warning said, against attempts to "iustifv "glorify terrorism" or terrorists". Coming out strongly against "double standards," Jaishankar said "terrorists are terrorists... there is no good or bad distinction". During his address, he also sought greater transparency and warned against placing blocks on listing and delisting requests without reason.

Education Industry



India's education sector offers a great opportunity with approximately 29% of India's population in the age group of 0 to 14 years. Education sector in India is expected to reach US\$ 180 billion in FY20. India was ranked 34 among the 100 countries in English Proficiency Index 2019. Increasing internet penetration is expected to help in education delivery. As of December 2019, internet penetration in India reached 54.29%. Education sector in India remains to be a strategic priority for the Government. The Government has allowed 100% Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in the education sector through the automatic route since 2002. The Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister, Mr Narendra Modi approved the National Education Policy 2020, making way for large scale, transformational reforms in both school and higher education sectors. The policy is built on foundational pillars of Access, Equity, Affordability Quality, and Accountability, and is aligned with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Agra Fort: Imposing Fort on the Banks of the River Yamuna

A massive red-sandstone fort located on the banks of River Yamuna was built under the commission of Emperor Akbar in 1565 and was further built by his grandson Shah Jahan. The fort, semicircular on plan, is surrounded by a 21.4 m high fortification wall. Agra Fort is widely considered to be a masterpiece of planning, design and construction. Some of its other internal structures include the stunning Moti Masjid, Diwan-i-Khas (hall of private audience) and Diwan-i-Aam (hall of public audience), once home to the legendary Peacock Throne. There are two prominent mosques inside the fort - Nagina Masjid was built by Shah Jahan as a private mosque for the ladies of the court and Mina Masjid is believed to have been built by him solely for his own use.
