India has celebrated its 72nd Republic Day on 26 January. The main function was held at Rajpath in the National Capital where President Ram Nath Kovind took the salute of the parade. During the function, indigenously developed Main Battle Tank of the Indian Army, T-90 Bhishma, Infantry Combat Vehicle BMP II, Brahmos Weapon System, Pinaka Bridge Laying tanks T-72, Samvijay Electronic Warfare System were the main attraction in the mechanised columns. Naval Tableau titled Swarnim Vijay Varsh showcased the Indian Navy's attack on Karachi harbour in 1971. A 122-member proud contingent of the Bangladesh armed forces also marched on Rajpath. India's military might, cultural diversity, social and economic progress were on display during the 72nd Republic Day celebrations at the majestic Rajpath in New Delhi. It showcased India's strides in indigenous defence technologies.

#### **PM Addresses World Economic Forum's Davos Dialogue**

While addressing the World Economic Forum's Davos Dialogue on 28 January via video conferencing, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said that he has brought the message of confidence, positivity and hope from 1.3 billion Indians amidst these times of apprehension. In India, fight against corona was turned into people's movement and India succeeded in saving lives of maximum number of its

citizens. He also talked about the world's biggest vaccination drive and India's global efforts during the pandemic. He informed that apart from the two-current 'Made in India' vaccines, more vaccines are in pipeline which will enable India to help the world at greater scale and speed.

# Nation Remembers Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose on His Birth Anniversary: 23rd January to be Celebrated as "PARAKRAM DIWAS" Every Year



To honour and remember the legendary freedom fighter and founder of Indian National Army, Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose's indomitable spirit and selfless service to the nation, Government of India has decided to celebrate his birthday on the 23rd day of January every year as "PARAKRAM DIWAS" to inspire people of the country, especially the youth, to act with fortitude in the face of adversity as Netaji did, and to infuse in them a spirit of patriotic fervour. From 23 January 2021, a year-long celebration to commemorate 125th birth anniversary year of Netaji has started. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi presided over the inaugural function of the 'Parakram Diwas' celebrations at Victoria Memorial in Kolkata. Speaking on the occasion, Prime Minister said, "Today is the birthday of that brave son of Maa Bharti who gave new direction to the dream of independent India. Today is the day we celebrate the consciousness that tore through the darkness of slavery and challenged the mightiest power of the world with the words that I will not beg for freedom, I will take it."

Vice President of India Shri M Venkaiah Naidu called upon the youth to be at the forefront in scripting India's growth story. 

## **Celebration of Birth Anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose**


