With number of people suffering from Coronavirus increasing very fast across the country, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 17 April reviewed the preparedness to handle the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. Various aspects relating to medicines, oxygen, ventilators, and vaccination were discussed. PM expressed his optimism that India, which had defeated Covid-19 last year, would do it again, with the same principles but faster speed and coordination. PM stressed that there is no substitute to testing, tracking and treatment. Early testing and proper tracking remain keys to reduce mortality.

#### Setting Up of 551 PSA Oxygen Generation Plants



In line with Prime Minister's direction of boosting availability of oxygen to hospitals, the PM CARES Fund has given in-principle approval for allocation of funds for installation of 551 dedicated Pressure Swing Adsorption (PSA) Medical Oxygen Generation Plants inside public health facilities in the country. PM has directed that these plants should be made functional as soon as possible. He said that these plants will serve as a major boost to oxygen availability at the district level. The basic aim behind establishing PSA Oxygen Generation Plants at Government hospitals in the district headquarters is to further strengthen the public health system and ensure that each of these hospitals has a captive oxygen generation facility.

"The world order that we built following the Second World War is under serious stress. The nature of threats faced by member states when the United Nations was founded 75 years ago has also changed," External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar remarked on 19 April while speaking at the UNSC Open Debate on Cooperation between the UN and regional and sub-regional organizations, chaired Vietnam. EAM supported closer engagement with the UN, in line with the UN Charter. Dr. Jaishankar cited ASEAN, BIMSTEC and African Union as three positive Indian experiences. EAM also recognised ASEAN centrality to India's Indo-Pacific vision.

### DRDO Develops SpO2 Based Supplemental Oxygen Delivery System

Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has developed SpO2 (Blood Oxygen Saturation) supplemental Oxygen Delivery System for soldiers posted at extreme high-altitude areas. Developed by Defence Bio-Engineering & Electro Medical Laboratory (DEBEL), Bengaluru of DRDO, the system delivers supplemental oxygen

based on the SpO2 levels and prevents the person from sinking in to a state of Hypoxia, which is fatal in most cases, if sets in. This automatic system can also prove to be a boon during the current Covid-19 situation as it can be used in the household for moderate Covid patients for Oxygen flow therapy with flow controlled at 2/5/7/10 lpm flow.

#### **India - A Biotech Growth Catalyst**

India is among the top 12 destinations for biotechnology in the world, approximately 3% share in the global Biotechnology industry, poised for growth as a key contributor of India's \$5 trillion economy target by FY 2024. India also plays a key role in the global vaccine market, as the leader in the global supply of DPT, BCG, and measles vaccines, and is a key contributor of 70% of WHO's vaccines (essential Immunization Schedule). India has the maximum no. of US FDA-approved manufacturing sites outside the US with 33% of total exports being supplied to the USA.

# **Medical Devices Industry**




India's medical device market is the fourth largest in Asia, following Japan, China, and South Korea. At present, the Indian medical devices sector stands at Rs. 77,539 crore (US\$ 11 billion) and is expected to reach Rs. 352,450 crore (US\$ 50 billion) by 2025. Rising number of medical facilities and introduction of the Medical Devices (Amendment) Rules 2020 will boost the demand for medical devices in the market. India has approved 100% FDIs—under the automatic route for both brownfield and greenfield setups in the sector. This is expected to boost the industry. Strong FDI inflow also reflects confidence among global players on the Indian medical devices market.


#### **Mountain Railways of India**



This site includes three railways. The Darjeeling Himalayan Railway, a UNESCO World Heritage site, was the first, and is still the most outstanding, example of a hill passenger railway. Opened in 1881, its design applies bold and ingenious engineering solutions to the problem of establishing an effective rail link across a mountainous terrain of great beauty. construction of the Nilgiri Mountain Railway, a 46-km long metre-gauge single-track railway in Tamil Nadu State was first proposed in 1854, but due to the difficulty of the mountainous location the work only started in 1891 and was completed in This railway, scaling elevation of 326 m to 2,203 m, represented the latest technology of the time. The Kalka-Shimla Railway, a

96-km long, single track working rail link built in the mid-19th century to provide a service to the highland town of Shimla is emblematic of the technical and material efforts to disenclave mountain populations through the railway.
