India-Vietnam Political Consultations and Strategic Dialogue

The 11th round of Political Consultations and the 8th round of Strategic Dialogue between the Foreign Ministries of India and Vietnam was held online between Smt. Riva Ganguly Das, Secretary (East), Ministry of External Affairs and Vice Foreign Minister Nguyen Quoc Dzung of Vietnam on 12 November.



Both sides reviewed the recent developments in India-Vietnam Comprehensive Strategic Partnership guided by the "Joint Vision for Peace, Prosperity and People" adopted by the Prime Ministers of India and Vietnam during their Virtual Summit in December 2020 and the Plan of Action for 2021-2023 signed by their Foreign Ministers. They expressed satisfaction over the sustained momentum in their multifaceted bilateral relations, despite the disruptions of the COVID-19 pandemic, with frequent high-level engagements through virtual platform. They also discussed future cooperation agenda, including high-level exchanges and celebrations to mark the 50th anniversary of India-Vietnam Diplomatic Relations in 2022.

Padma Awards 2021 The Padma Awards are among the highest civilian honours of India that are announced

annually and given in three categories: Padma Vibhushan (for exceptional and distinguished service), Padma Bhushan (distinguished service of higher order) and Padma Shri (distinguished service). Over the past years, the Padma Awards have truly become People's Awards, celebrating extraordinary feats of common people and recognizing their monumental contribution to their local community and for the betterment of India. This year the President of India has approved conferment of 119 Padma Awards including 7 Padma Vibhushan, 10 Padma Bhushan and 102 Padma Shri Awards, among which 29 are women, 1 is transgender, 10 are foreigners/Indian overseas, and 16 are posthumous. In 2018, Most Venerable Thich Duc Thien, Vice Chairman and General Secretary of the Vietnam Buddhist Sangha became the first Padma Shri Awardee from Vietnam. READ MORE

On 3 November, the WHO granted emergency use listing to COVAXIN developed by India's Bharat Biotech. COVAXIN is recommended for all age groups 18 and above and has been found to have 78% efficacy against COVID-19 of any severity. It is extremely suitable for low- and middle-income countries due to easy storage requirements. According to India's Health Minister Mansukh



Mandaviya, Covaxin has been recognized by around 100 countries so far. On 10 November, the Health Ministry of Vietnam also granted the emergency authorization of COVAXIN in Vietnam.

PM Launches Two Innovative Customer Centric Initiatives of Reserve Bank of India

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on 12 November launched two innovative customer centric initiatives of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) viz. Retail Direct Scheme and the Reserve Bank - Integrated Ombudsman Scheme via video conference. Addressing the event, the Prime Minister said that these schemes will expand the scope of investment in India and make access to capital markets easier, more secure for investors. The Retail Direct Scheme has given small investors in the country a simple and safe medium of investment in government securities. Similarly, 'One Nation One Ombudsman' system has taken shape in the banking sector with the

Integrated Ombudsman Scheme. The PM stressed the needs to keep the citizens of the country at the center and keep on strengthening the trust of the investors. He believed that the RBI will continue to strengthen India's new identity as a sensitive and investor-friendly destination.

Two flight tests of indigenously-developed smart anti-airfield weapon were carried out jointly by Defence Research & Development Organisation (DRDO) and Indian Air Force (IAF). The weapon was launched by an IAF aircraft from Chandan ranges at Rajasthan on 28 October and 3 November. Electro optical configuration of the system is equipped with Ima ging Infra-Red (IIR) Seeker technology enhancing the precision strike capability of the weapon. In both the tests, the intended target was hit with high accuracy. The system is designed for a maximum range 100 kilometres. All the mission objectives were achieved.

Union Minister of State for Science & Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh on 29 October launched India's first Manned Ocean Mission 'Samudravan' at Chennai. The Minister said that this niche technology shall facilitate Ministry of Earth Sciences in carrying out deep ocean exploration of the non-living resources such as polymetallic manganese nodules, gas hydrates, hydro-thermal sulphides and cobalt crusts, located at a depth between 1000 and 5500 meters. With the launch of this Unique Ocean Mission, India joins the elite club of developed nations such as the U.S., Russia, Japan, France and China to have such underwater vehicles for carrying out subsea activities.

New India Making Healthcare Accessible



The Healthcare industry in India - comprising of hospitals, medical devices, clinical trials, outsourcing, telemedicine, medical tourism, health insurance, and medical equipment – has been growing at a tremendous pace owing to its strengthening coverage, services, and increasing expenditure by public as well private players. The Indian Healthcare market is expected to reach US\$372 billion by 2022 at a CAGR of 39%. The hospital industry in India, accounting for 80% of the total healthcare market, is witnessing a huge investor demand from both global as well as domestic investors. It is expected to reach US\$132 billion by 2023 from US\$61.8 billion in 2017; growing at a CAGR of 16-17%.

India also has the world's largest Health Insurance Scheme (Ayushman Bharat) supported by the government and is covering 500 million people. Over 70,000 Ayushman Bharat centers, which aim at providing primary health care services to communities closer to their homes, are operational in India.

The ancient city of Sravasti is a major pilgrimage centre for Buddhism and draws a large number of devotees from India and abroad. Sprawled along the banks of River Rapti, the city once served as the capital of the Kosala kingdom, ruled by king Pasenadi, a disciple of Lord Buddha. The most popular tourist attraction in this ancient city is Miracle Stupa, where Lord Buddha is said to have spent his time after attaining enlightenment. His sermons and teachings made Sravasti an important centre for Buddhist learnings.
