Celebration of the 73rd Republic Day of India

India marked its 73rd Republic Day with fervour and enthusiasm on 26 January. The country's diverse culture and prowess of the Armed Forces was displayed at Rajpath in New Delhi. In his address to the nation on the eve of the Republic Day, President Shri Ram Nath Kovind said that: "This is an occasion for the people to celebrate Indian-ness. It was on this day in 1950 that India was established as the largest democratic republic and 'we the people' put into effect a Constitution that is an inspired document of the country's collective vision. It is this spirit of unity and of being one nation which is celebrated every year as Republic Day. This year's celebrations may be muted due to the pandemic, but the spirit is as strong as ever".



The Republic Day Parade ceremony commenced with Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi visiting the National War Memorial. The celebrations this year were special since 2022 is also the 75th anniversary of India's Independence, being celebrated as 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' across the country. To mark the occasion, the Ministry of Defence conceptualised a series of new events during the main parade on Rajpath on 26th January and 'Beating the Retreat'

ceremony on 29th January. Several firsts were planned during the main parade including a grand flypast by 75 aircraft/helicopters of the Indian Air Force; cultural performances by 480 dancers; installation of 10 large LED screens; among others. A <u>drone show</u> by 1,000 indigenously developed drones was showcased for 'Beating the Retreat' ceremony, along with a stunning



India Celebrates the 125th Birth Anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose



In order to commemorate the 125th birth anniversary of the great freedom fighter Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and as part of the year long celebrations, the Government of India has decided to install a grand statue of Netaji at India Gate. The statue, made of granite, shall be a fitting tribute to the immense contribution of Netaji in India's freedom struggle, and would be a symbol of the country's indebtedness to him. Till the work for the statue is completed, a hologram statue of Netaji has been placed at the same place. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi unveiled the hologram statue on 23 January. In a step to realize the Prime Minister's vision of honouring the freedom fighters in a befitting manner, it was announced in 2021 that Netaji's birth anniversary would be celebrated as Parakram Diwas, Day of Valour, every

year.

In Vietnam, to celebrate the occasion, the Embassy of India in Hanoi hosted a number of activities, including a floral tribute at the Embassy premises; a blood donation camp jointly organized with the Indian Business Chamber



at the Vietnam National Institute of Hematology and Blood Transfusion; and the 5th edition of the

Vande Bharat Quiz on the life and vision of Netaji which was participated by students from both the Indian diaspora as well as students from the University of Social Sciences and Humanities (USSH).

Prime Minister Addresses the World Economic Forum

Indian youth with their global skills are ready to take your businesses & ideas to new heights Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi delivered 'State of the World' special address at the World Economic Forum's Davos Agenda on 17 January via video conference.

He said that India is tackling another wave of the pandemic with caution and confidence and moving ahead in the economic sphere with many hopeful results. During Corona time, India saved many lives by exporting essential medicines and vaccines by following its vision of 'One Earth, One Health'. He noted that India is the world's third largest pharmaceutical producer and is considered the 'pharmacy of the world'.

The Prime Minister added that today, India is providing record number of software engineers. More than 5 million software developers are working in India. India has third largest number of unicorns today with

over 10 thousand start-ups have registered during the last six months. He affirmed that India is committed to become world's reliable partner in global supply-chains and is making way for free trade agreements with many countries. India's capabilities in innovation, technology adaptation and entrepreneurship spirit makes India an ideal global partner. And "That's why, this is the best time to invest in India", he said.

India's Economic Survey 2021-22

Union Minister for Finance & Corporate Affairs, Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Economic Survey 2021-22 in Parliament on 31 January. The highlights of the State of the Economy are as follows:

- Indian economy estimated to grow by 9.2 percent in real terms in 2021-22 (as per first advanced estimates) subsequent to a contraction of 7.3 percent in 2020-21.
- GDP projected to grow by 8- 8.5 percent in real terms in 2022-23.
- The year ahead poised for a pickup in private sector investment with the financial system in good position to provide support for economy's revival.
- Projection comparable with World Bank and Asian Development Bank's latest forecasts of real GDP growth of 8.7 percent and 7.5 percent respectively for 2022-23.
- As per IMF's latest World Economic Outlook projections, India's real GDP projected to grow at 9 percent in 2021-22 and 2022-23 and at 7.1 percent in 2023-2024, which would make India the fastest growing major economy in the world for all 3 years.
- Agriculture and allied sectors expected to grow by 3.9 percent; industry by 11.8 percent and services sector by 8.2 percent in 2021-22.
- Macroeconomic stability indicators suggest that the Indian Economy is well placed to take on the challenges of 2022-23.



short 20-minute drive from Puducherry will bring visitors to Auroville, a universal township founded by Mother Mirra in 1968. At its core lies *Matrimandir*, a brilliant golden dome surrounded by green lawns. Fondly known as the "Soul of the City", Matrimandir, which simply means the "Temple of The Mother" or "Mother's Shrine" welcomes people to practice integral yoga so that they can silently concentrate on their inner self and discover mental peace from within the body.

Featuring a lotus bud-shaped domestyled spherical structure, the edifice of *Matrimandir* is unique in its own way. It presents a fine blend of traditional Indian and modern Western

architecture that is surrounded by twelve petals and boasts a meditation chamber made of white marble floor and walls. Another important thing to see within the premises of *Matrimandir* is its 12 gardens and are named as Existence, Perfection, Bliss, Youth, Consciousness, Harmony, Light, Progress, Wealth, Power, Life, and Utility.


