in the second in-person Quad Leaders' Summit in Japan on 24 May. The Leaders reiterated their shared commitment to a free, open and inclusive Indo-Pacific and the importance of upholding the principles of sovereignty, territorial integrity and peaceful resolution of disputes. They exchanged perspectives on developments in the Indo-Pacific and the conflict in Europe. Prime Minister Modi highlighted India's consistent and principled position on the need for cessation of hostilities, resumption of dialogue and diplomacy. The Leaders also took stock of ongoing Quad collaboration and their vision for the future.

Reviewing Quad's ongoing efforts to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, the Leaders welcomed the enhanced manufacturing capacity of Biological-E facility in India and the gift of 525,000 doses of India's vaccines under

Prime Minister Addresses the 2nd Global Covid Summit

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi participated in the Second Global COVID Virtual Summit at the invitation of US President Joe Biden on 12 May. The PM delivered his remarks in the Opening Session of the Summit on the theme 'Preventing Pandemic Fatigue and Prioritizing Preparedness'.



PM highlighted that India adopted a people-centric

strategy to fight the pandemic and has made the highest ever allocation for its health budget this year. He stated that India was running the largest vaccination campaign in the world and had vaccinated close to 90% of its adult population and more than 50 million children. PM also highlighted that as a responsible member of the global community, India would continue to play an active role by sharing its low-cost indigenous COVID mitigation technologies, vaccines and therapeutics with other countries. India is working to extend its genomic surveillance consortium. India has used traditional medicine extensively and has laid the foundation for a WHO Center for Traditional Medicine in India to make this knowledge available to the world.

PM Modi Addresses ICDRI 2022

PM Modi Lays Foundation Stone for Buddhist Centre in Nepal



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi paid an official visit to Lumbini, Nepal on 16 May coinciding with the auspicious occasion of Vaishakha Buddha Purnima. PM Modi and PM Deuba of Nepal visited the Mayadevi temple, within which lies the birthplace of Lord Buddha. At the temple, the PMs attended prayers conducted as per Buddhist rituals and made offerings. They lit lamps and visited the historical Ashoka Pillar, which carries the first epigraphic evidence of Lumbini being the birthplace of Lord Buddha.

PM Modi together with PM Deuba participated in the "Shilanyas" ceremony for the construction of the India International Centre for Buddhist Culture and Heritage at a plot in Lumbini. After the "Shilanyas" (foundation laying) ceremony, the Prime Ministers also unveiled a model of the Buddhist centre, which is envisaged as a Net-Zero compliant world-class facility and would be open to Buddhist pilgrims and tourists from around the world. The built-up area is 6300m2 and it will be the first building in Nepal with Net Zero Emission. The cost of the project is around Rs 984.6 million (US\$12.7 million).






Shri Saurabh Kumar, Secretary (East), MEA visited Hanoi on 30 May and co-chaired the 12th Political Consultations and the 9th Strategic Dialogue between the Foreign Ministries of India and Vietnam with his counterpart, Vice Foreign Minister H.E. Mr. Nguyen Minh Vu. The two leaders expressed satisfaction over the sustained momentum in their multifaceted relations, despite the disruptions of the COVID-19 pandemic, with frequent high-level engagements, including the recent telephone conversation between Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and Party General Secretary H.E. Mr. Nguyen Phu Trong, as well as the visit of Speaker of Lok Sabha to Vietnam in April 2022. The two sides also discussed future cooperation agenda, including high-level exchanges and activities to mark the 50th anniversary of India-Vietnam Diplomatic Relations this year. Both sides exchanged views on regional and international issues of mutual interest as they explored new opportunities for partnership to support each other's economic development and national security. Secretary (East) reaffirmed India's position of regarding Vietnam as a key partner in our Act East Policy and the Indo-Pacific Vision. Both sides expressed satisfaction over their close coordination at regional and multilateral forums. They agreed to enhance their bilateral cooperation in line with India's Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative and the ASEAN's Outlook on Indo-Pacific to achieve shared security, prosperity and growth for all in the region. During his visit, Secretary (East) also called on the Foreign Minister of Vietnam H.E. Mr. Bui Thanh Son.

3rd ICWA – VASS Dialogue







The 3rd Annual Dialogue between premier academies of India and Vietnam, the Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) and the Vietnam Academy of Social Sciences (VASS) was held on 26 May in Hanoi. Director General of ICWA, Ambassador Vijay Thakur Singh led the delegation of Indian scholars, while Vice President of VASS Dr. Dang Xuan Thanh led the Vietnamese delegation during the dialogue.

This edition of dialogue coincided with the 50th anniversary of the establishment of India-Vietnam Diplomatic Relations and was themed as "Strengthening Vietnam-India Comprehensive Strategic Partnership". Discussions covered a wide-range of bilateral, regional and global issues of shared interest. Scholars from both sides agreed that on the foundations of deep mutual trust and understanding, India-Vietnam relations are poised to grow stronger amidst the emerging geo-political and geo-economic trends in the region and the world. During the visit, DG ICWA also met the President of VASS, H.E. Mr. Bui Nhat Quang.

Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh launched two frontline warships of the Indian Navy - 'Surat' and 'Udaygiri' - in Mumbai on 17 May. 'Surat' is the fourth Guided Missile Destroyer of P15B class, while 'Udaygiri' is the second Stealth Frigate of P17A class. Both warships have been designed in-house by the Directorate of Naval Design (DND) and built at Mazagon Docks Limited (MDL), Mumbai. The Defence Minister described the warships as an embodiment of the Government's unwavering commitment to enhancing the country's maritime capability, with focus on achieving Aatmanirbhar Bharat, at a time when the world is witnessing disruption in global supply chain. The Minister stated that the warships will be among the most technologically advanced missile carriers in the world. In the times to come, India will not only fulfill its own needs, but will also meet the shipbuilding requirements of the world. PM Modi's vision of 'Make in India, Make for the World' will soon be realized.

IAF Successfully Fires Extended Range Version of Brahmos from Su-30 MKI



India on 12 May successfully fired the Extended Range Version of BrahMos Air Launched missile from Su-30 MKI fighter aircraft. The launch from the aircraft was as planned and the missile achieved a direct hit on the designated target in the Bay of Bengal region.

It was the first launch of Extended Range version of BrahMos missile from Su-30MKI aircraft. With this, the IAF has achieved the capability to carry out precision strikes from Su-30MKI aircraft against a land/ sea target over very long ranges. The dedicated and synergetic efforts of the IAF, Indian Navy, DRDO, BAPL and HAL have proven the capability



of the nation to achieve this feat. The extended range capability of the missile coupled with the high performance of the Su-30MKI aircraft gives the IAF a strategic reach and allows it to dominate the future battle fields.

Pinaka Mk-I (Enhanced) Rocket System Successfully Tested by DRDO



Pinaka Mk-I (Enhanced) Rocket System (EPRS) and Pinaka Area Denial Munition (ADM) rocket systems have been successfully flight-tested by Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Indian Army at Pokhran Firing Ranges. A total of 24 EPRS rockets were fired for different ranges in April. Required accuracy and consistency was achieved by the rockets meeting all trial objectives satisfactorily.

The EPRS is the upgraded version of Pinaka variant which has been in service with the Indian Army for the last decade. The system has been upgraded with advanced technologies enhancing the range to meet the emerging requirements. After establishing the performance efficacy of the enhanced range version of Pinaka, the technology was transferred to the industries viz. Munitions India Limited (MIL) and Economic Explosives Limited Nagpur. Different variants of munitions and fuzes which can be used in the Pinaka rocket system were also successfully test evaluated in the Pokhran Field Firing Range.



India retains top spot as fastest-growing major economy: UN report

According to the UN, India will be the fastestgrowing major economy this fiscal year, with economic growth estimated at 6.4%. Chief of the UN's Global Economic Monitoring Branch Mr. Hamid Rashid said that he expects Indian recovery will be strong in the short term which is the next 1-2 years. When asked about India's stronger prospects economic performance and in comparison to the other major nations he attributed it to lower inflation, which does not necessitate as much monetary tightening as many of the other countries. Last fiscal year, India's economy grew by 8.8%. The IMF predicted an 8.2% growth rate in 2021-22, whereas the World Bank predicted 8%.



INDIA EMERGING AS PREFERRED Investment destination amongst global investors



According to the Ministry of Commerce and Industry of India, the country has recorded highest ever annual FDI inflow of US\$83.57 billion in the Financial Year 2021-22. In 2014-2015, FDI inflow in India stood at mere US\$45.15 billion as compared to the highest ever annual FDI inflow of US\$83.57 billion reported during the financial year 2021-22 overtaking last year's FDI by US\$1.6 billion despite military operation in Ukraine and COVID-19 pandemic. India's FDI inflows have increased 20-fold since FY03-04, when the inflows were US\$4.3 billion only. Further, India is rapidly emerging as a preferred country for foreign

investments in the manufacturing sector. The trends in India's Foreign Direct Investment inflow are an endorsement of its status as a preferred investment destination amongst global investors.

Shravasti

The ancient city of Sravasti is a major pilgrimage centre for Buddhists and draws a large number of devotees from India and foreign countries. Sprawled along the banks of River Rapti, the city once served as the capital of the Kosala kingdom, ruled by King Pasenadi, a disciple of Lord Buddha. The most popular tourist attraction in this ancient city is Miracle Stupa, where Lord Buddha is said to have spent his time after attaining enlightenment. His sermons and teachings made Sravasti an important centre for Buddhist learnings. Other

must-visit tourist sites include the Angulimala's Stupa, the remains of which os one of the largest mounds found in Mahet area of Sravasti. The terraced stupa is built on a rectangular plain. Tourists can also visit the nearby Kachhi Kuti, the ruins of the Anathapindika Stupa. Sravasti lies at a distance of 107 km from Ayodhya and makes for a great exploration.

Ambassador Visits Tien Giang Province



Ambassador Pranay Verma visited Tien Giang Province in the Mekong Delta region of Vietnam on 14 May to inaugurate a Quick Impact Project (QIP) for two rain water storage reservoirs in the coastal district of Tan Phu Dong built with grant assistance of Government of India. The area suffers from severe shortage of clean water. With the construction of these reservoirs, more than 500 households have now got access to clean drinking

water. During his visit to the project site, Ambassador interacted with local beneficiaries and thanked them for their active cooperation in quick completion of the project. He was joined during the visit by the Vice Chairman of People's Council of Tien Giang, Mr. Tran Thanh Nguyen and Consul General of India, Dr. Madan Mohan Sethi. The project is part of seven QIPs in water resource management in the Mekong Delta Region undertaken with Indian assistance in the last one year.

The new water channel infrastructure created with GOI assistance will restrict sea water from entering into nearly 100 hectares of fruit orchard, thereby directly benefitting local community in

During Ambassador's interaction with the local community members, they expressed deep appreciation for India's assistance for this project and noted that it had raised the annual income of each household by nearly US\$ 2000. Ambassador was joined by the Vice Chairman of Ben Tre, Mr. Nguyen Minh Canh during the event.
